

Led by a dedicated team of psychometrists, researchers, and teachers under registered practice.



WHAT

A day of camp begins with a warm and relaxed check-in, where we welcome the child in their zone of regulation and bring the group into the green zone - ready to learn for the day!

We cultivate a growth mindset by talking about learning disabilities. This discussion leads to knowledge about how their brain works, and what it needs to work best! Early in the morning we have short, but intense lessons on core academic skills of reading, writing, and math, using evidence based practice. Later, we have social skills training through fun games and play! We then work on using strategies through explicit instruction on scheduling, organization, attention and focus. We wind down the morning with mindfulness practices.

The purpose of this intensive 10-day camp is to LEARN *how to LEARN*. The beneficial skills and strategies learned in this special program are transferable to a child's academics in school, life skills and beyond.

Through small group guidance our camp imparts targeted instruction in the following areas:

- Metacognition of their learning disabilities and their unique learning strengths and needs
- Strategies that play to their cognitive strengths
- Explicit social skills training, with ample opportunities to practice them through play
- Core academic skills focused on reading, writing, and mathematics
- Tools to manage and succeed with time management, organization, and executive functioning skills
- Mindfulness instruction, training, and practice
